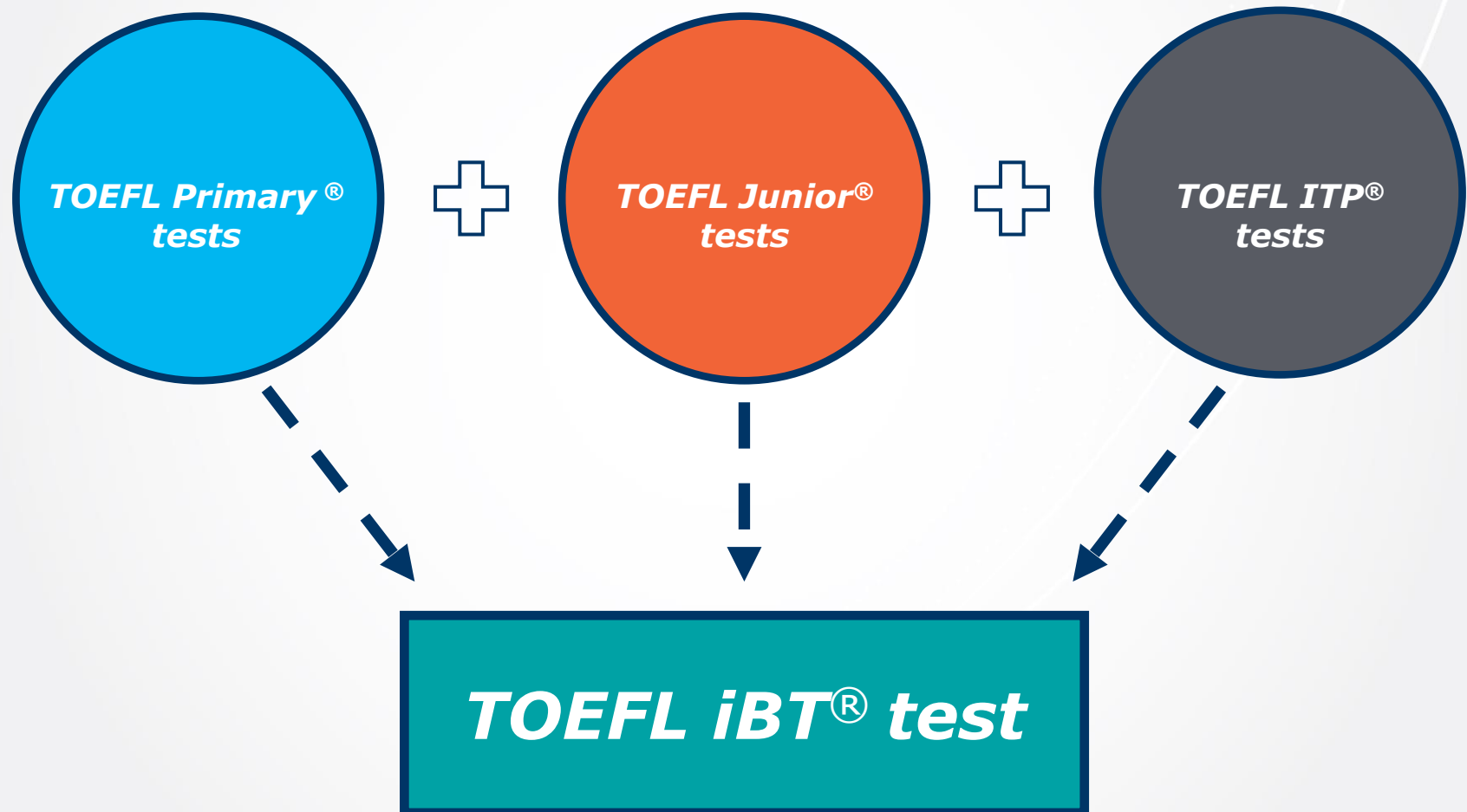

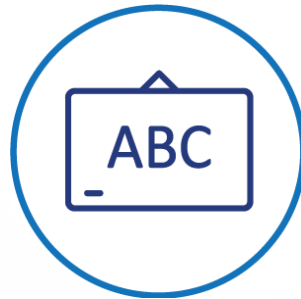
## Academic Content

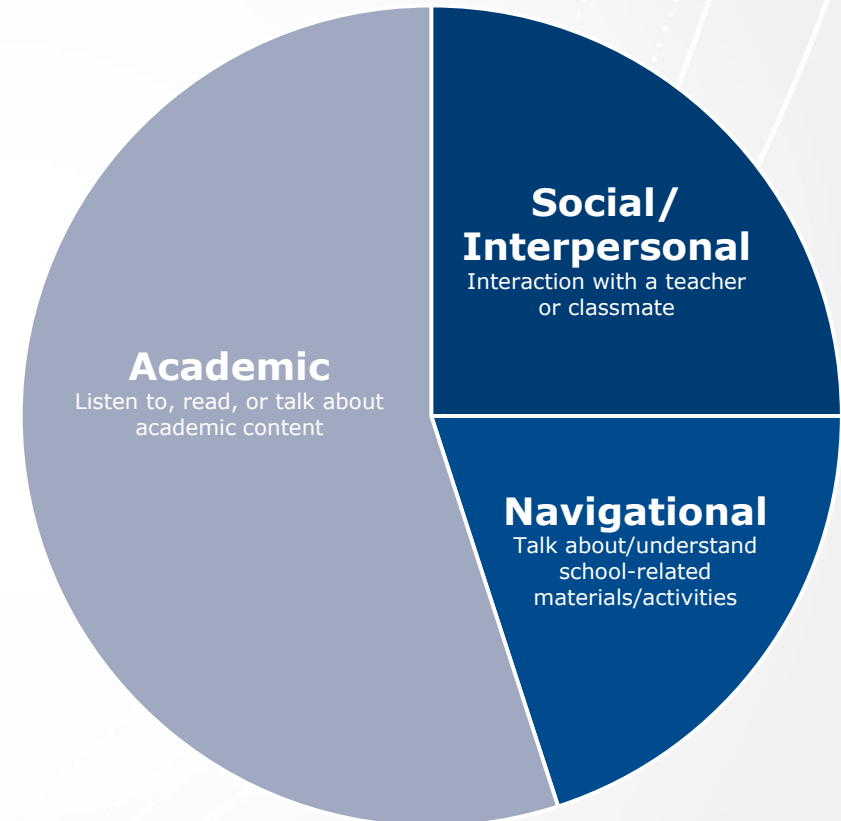

- Use performance feedback, including can-do statements to instructors, to tailor English instruction and guide conversations with parents

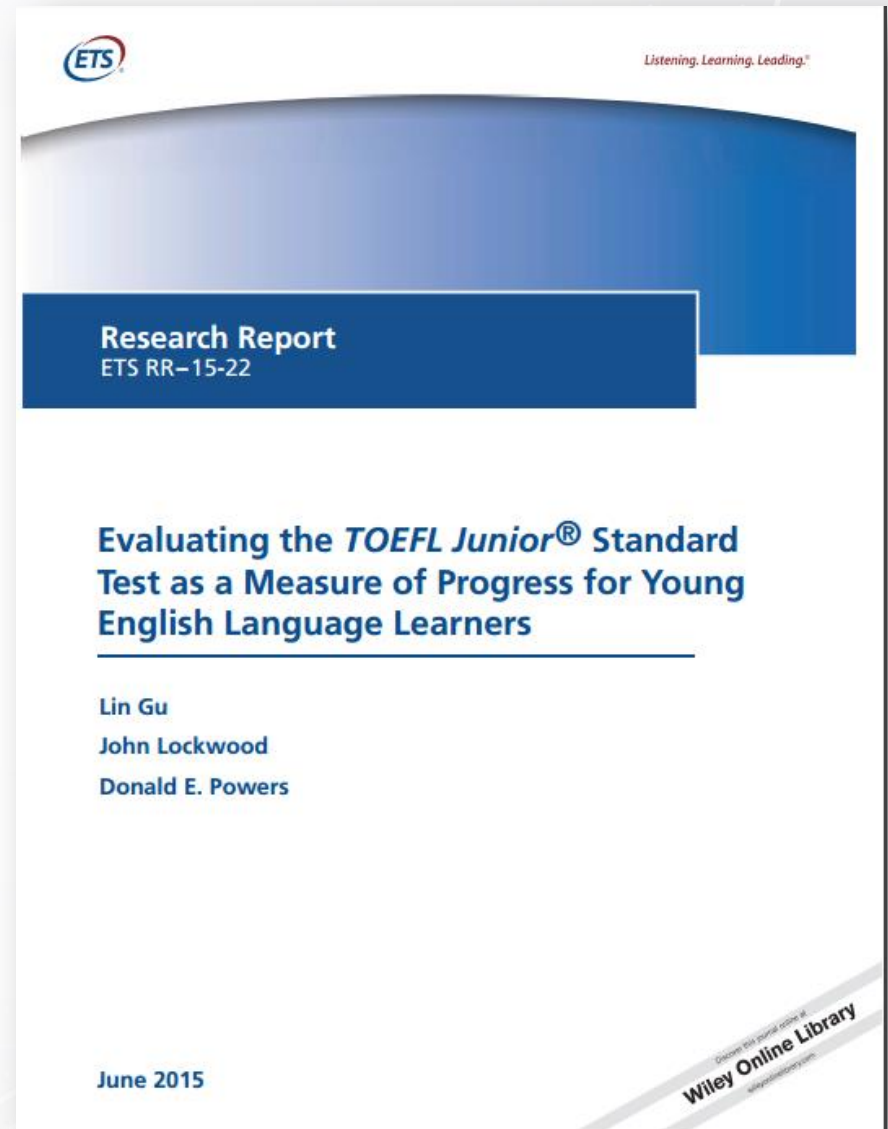
