Provides assessment to new/younger learners.

Expanding the TOEFL brand to primary school-aged learners.

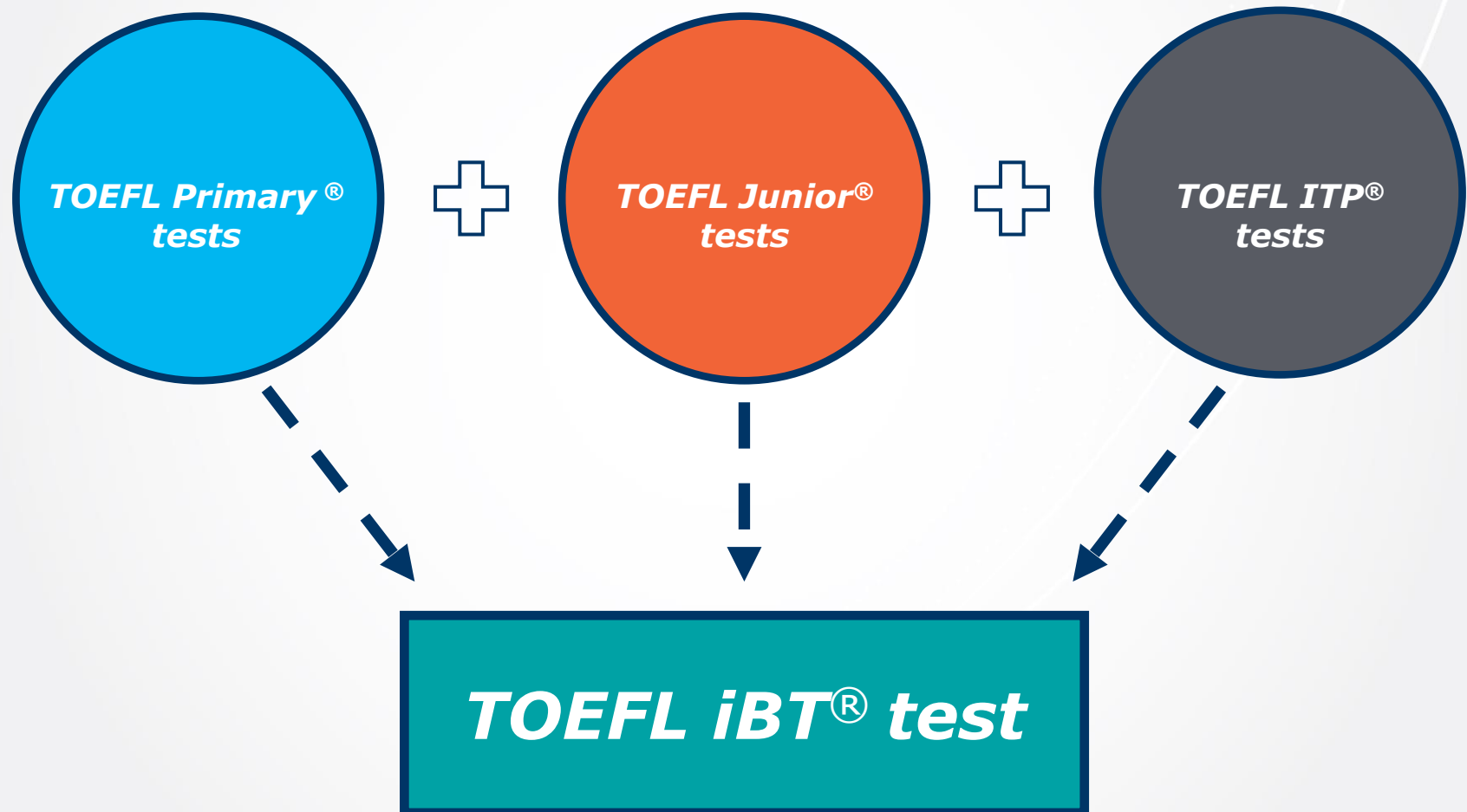
Assessing 4-skill English proficiency

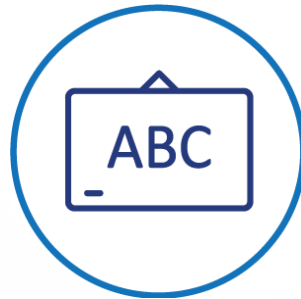
Academic Content

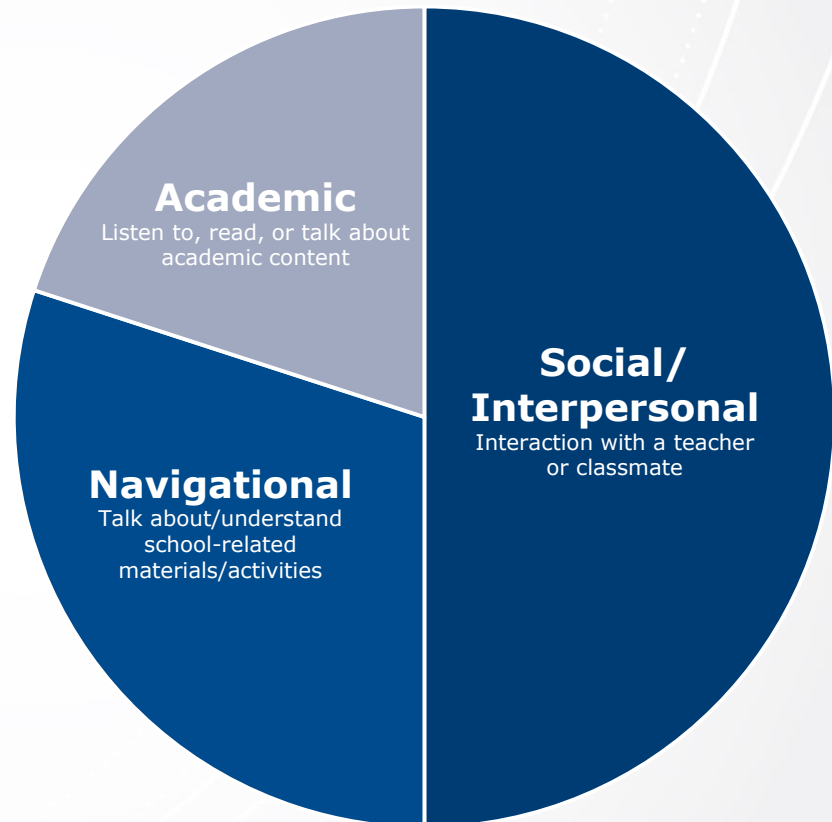


How to use the *TOEFL Primary*[®] tests
