#### **A Class Project**

The maps provide a great example for your students to make a map of their own country.

First, do one of the activities mentioned on this site so that students understand the map well.

Discuss with them the different places on the map:

cities, national parks, tourist sights, other places of interest, cultural aspects, ...

Ask them to think of places in their country. Write these on the board. When you have a complete list, ask students to choose one of the places.

Tell students to write a short text about then place. You can also let them do some research at home. Remind them that the text is very short, like the ones on the poster.

Then, tell students to choose a picture for the place and bring it to class.

In class, help students make the poster. When it is finished, display in the classroom or in the school. It is very motivating if you take a photo the class with their poster.
