**Lake Louise** was named after Queen Victoria's fourth daughter. You can go out in a boat on the lake, but the water is too cold to swim in.



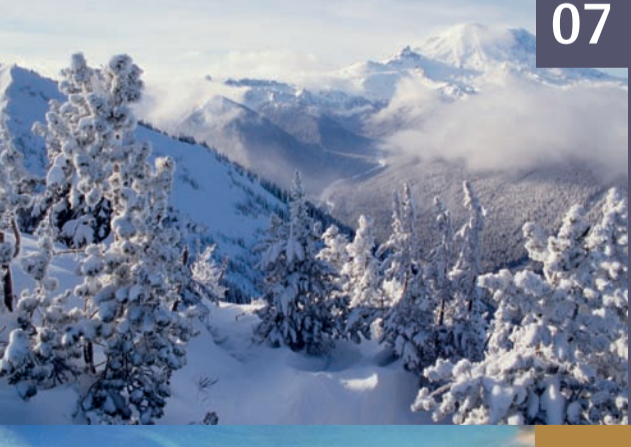

**Washington DC** is the capital of the USA. It is different from most American cities because it has no skyscrapers.

The **Grand Canyon**, in **Arizona**, is a deep valley made by the River Colorado cutting through the rock many thousands of years ago.

**Texas** is the second biggest state after **Alaska**. There are still cowboys who work there, but the modern state of Texas is rich because of its oil.

Jazz was born in the city of **New Orleans**. Many musicians still come here every year to play in the Jazz Festival.
